### **Experience Gathering**

The outreach work has progressed well this quarter, with a good mix of interaction across the areas of the community outlined in our last Equality Impact Assessment (this included men, older people and faith groups). 



# **Issues by Service**

### **Projects**

#### I Pledge Project

The Children's Engagement Worker engaged with 5 primary schools in Barnsley doing a 45 minute sessions in each school, highlighting the importance of dental hygiene as well as gathering the opinions of young people relating to their views on dentists.

For this project we engaged with young people's experiences of Dental Services, we were able to speak with 188 children and young people at the following schools during this 45 minute session. The schools we engaged with are:

- Ward Green Primary School
- Joseph Lock Primary school
- Dodworth St Johns C of E Primary Academy
- Athersley South Primary School
- Elsecar Holy Trinity CE Primary School

The main purpose of this session was to highlight the importance of dental hygiene, and to find out how much young people knew about looking after their teeth; the key points asked to the young people were;

- How many times a day should you brush your teeth?
- How long should you brush your teeth for each time you brush them?
- How often should you visit the dentist?
- What is a fluoride varnish?

We also asked children and young people about their experiences of visiting their dental practice. The main focus was on the following five areas:

- If children and young people have been to the dentist lately and how often they attend and also is this a regular trend.
- The opinions, experiences and views, of children and young people who have used the dentist.
- If children and young people were aware of the new super hero scheme launched by Public Health in 2015.

The feedback we received outlined their experiences and opinions of 20 dental practices covering all six ward areas of Barnsley.

# **Actions & Interventions**

### Impact

The following are examples of some ongoing (still open) and recently closed actions/interventions, including immediate actions and longer cases.

#### Issue Raised June 2015 • Carers Grant Identification Scheme

Following guidance from central Government many GP practices have set up carers' registers to enable carers to obtain extra support. It was becoming apparent through feedback that there

#### are Carers within Barnsley who need to register with their GP to access this support and gather further information which would help them in their day-today caring role.

#### Action

Healthwatch Barnsley was awarded a grant through the Carers Forum to work within GP surgeries to identify carers (who do not see themselves as carers i.e. I just look after ....) and encourage them to register as carers with the Surgery.

As a result of this guidance many GP practices have set up carers' registers to enable carers to have this extra support, which also gives them access to annual health checks, flexible appointments double appointments when necessary and annual flu vaccinations.

Three surgeries were identified and approached to work with us. Royston Practice Dodworth and Walderslade practice in Hoyland. Walderslade were very interested in working with us on this project. We provided awareness raising training with the staff, and went on to use Walderslade Practice as a pilot to demonstrate the effectiveness of outreach & engagement work within a surgery to improve uptake of this initiative. Further to our meetings with Walderslade Surgery in Hoyland, Healthwatch Barnsley provided staff awareness training, awareness and information training for the Patient participation group and 3 awareness raising sessions for patients during September, November and December 2015 at the surgery.

We also offered a private consultation room to speak privately to patients if they wished and offered a Healthwatch Outreach Surgery in case there were issues Healthwatch could support with in general terms.

We worked in the reception area in order to speak to carers about the benefits of registering with the surgery as a carer. This would be highlighted on their notes through a flagging system that they are a carer and therefore might have specific needs when attending an appointment for themselves.

#### Action continued

In these sessions we have also promoted the fact that a carer is entitled to have a flu injection regardless of their age. We discussed Carers assessments with people highlighting how this can benefit both the carer and the person they are caring for and how to request this for themselves.

Each person we interacted with was given a Carers Booklet which we have produced, with further information and a list of contact numbers for organisations they might need in the future. Highlighting the carers assessment contact number should they wish to use it.

We organised to attend the surgery as an information session, talking to patients to establish whether they were aware of this support and to give them further information and advice.

In total we talked to 40 patients, who then went on to register with their GP as carers.

#### Outcome

We were then invited to look at how organisations can work together to benefit carers and their families in the Hoyland area. At a group meeting consisting of organisations and individuals, each person spoke a little about the work they were doing. We then looked at how working and networking together can benefit carers and their families.

An item for the Surgery newsletter was produced and printed in an issue of Walderslades newsletter on the benefits of carers letting the surgery know they are carers. This introduced the work further to the Hoyland community as a whole, when people picked it up and took it home, therefore giving further reach to the information in the community. We also met with the Carers Forum to provide an update on our work. As a result of this we have provided the Carers I.D. leaflet electronically to Jane Beech (adult safeguarding) and Debbie Pye to be distributed electronically to organisations and community groups. This will ensure that information on registering as a carer with your G.P. and the benefits of doing this will now be across the Barnsley area.

Hopefully other areas within Barnsley will hear about the work through the leaflet we have produced and the networking we have done in the Hoyland area. If GPs now see the benefit of the work we have done then this information can be replicated across the borough, thus increasing the number of carers registered with their practices, and gaining the support they are entitled to.

### **Example of work**

Healthwatch Barnsley and Voluntary Action Barnsley were commissioned by Sheffield Commissioners Working Together, (which are a collaborative of eight clinical commissioning groups and NHS England, working together across South and Mid Yorkshire, Bassetlaw and North Derbyshire on the Sustainable Transformation Plans), in order to do a piece of work to engage the community 'in a conversation' about what they think about their local plan.

Specifically for Healthwatch our brief was to engage hard to reach and the seldom heard groups to look at the local Barnsley Plan within the South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw Sustainable Transformation Plans.

We used a six week window mid-February to the end of March working in conjunction with all other Healthwatch in the South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw areas. The raw data from each individual area was then collated across the whole South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw footprint, and fed back to the Commissioners Working Together group.

Healthwatch Barnsley engaged with thirteen groups in this time, facilitated two Focus Groups and engaged with staff within Voluntary Action Barnsley. The online survey produced by Commissioners Working Together was shared on our website and social media to ensure we spread the word and provided the information about the Local Place Plan to a wider audience.

At each group meeting we ensured people had a chance to read the plan discuss this together and as individuals were offered the chance to either fill in a paper survey which we could input on their behalf on to the system or, alternatively fill in the online survey.



Our two Focus Groups were organised to be on the same day. They were two hour sessions with a small group of people who had an interest in exploring the Place Based Plan in more detail. The sessions were set for over lunchtime and early evening to ensure we could accommodate people who may be working or had caring responsibilities etc. All comments and questions from the groups were fed back to the Commissioners Working Together and replies to specific queries were answered by the said organisation.




