

University Medical Centre Surgery: findings from a Healthwatch Reading visit

Where: University Medical Practice, 9 Northcourt Avenue, Reading RG2 7HE

When: 5 November 2015, for two hours in the morning

Who: 30 people in the waiting area spoke with two Healthwatch staff members

Why: Healthwatch Reading is visiting all local GP surgeries to get patient views

How: Healthwatch used 'Enter and View' powers to visit on a pre-agreed date



What patients like

- 27 out of 30 patients were satisfied or very satisfied with opening times
- 15/30 patients could get a same-day urgent appointment and 8 out of 30, sometimes
- 29/30 praised the quality of care, treatment and service



What patients dislike

- 2 out of 30 could not always see a doctor or nurse of their choice & they would prefer to
- One patient needed access to an interpreter but was unware that this could be offered



Healthwatch observations

- A signs asks patients to respect the privacy of people ahead of them in the queue at reception
- A box was at reception for patients to submit questions or comments about proposals for merger with another practice.
- The practice complaints and comments leaflet was included in leaflets for patients
- Waiting room signage is welcoming, directing and clear.
- Staff are courteous and respectful to patients & visitors



Patients' suggestions

 One person suggested more Saturday appointments

'Everyone has always been extremely helpful for any problem that I have had.'

'I still struggle to see the doctor I would like after work - often have to book 3-4 weeks in advance.' 'The online system is excellent and allows me to find a time with the doctor I wish to see at a time convenient to me... instead of feeling rushed deciding a time on the phone.'

'Occasionally I have had to see doctors I am unfamiliar with.'





How the surgery has responded to the patient feedback

'The University of Reading Medical Practice would like to thank patients for giving their time to share views and valuable feedback. We recognise and appreciate during busy periods it can at times be difficult to book in with the GP of your choice at short notice. We offer online appointments which can be booked up to 6 weeks in advance and a guaranteed on-the-day appointment for any patient who feels their condition is urgent and cannot wait for a routine appointment.
