GP website audit – Background



Healthwatch Wigan and Leigh is interested in how local services communicate with patients about both current services and service changes.

In line with this topic an audit was conducted of the GP websites in Wigan and Leigh. The purpose of the audit was to see to what extent GP Practice websites are providing clear and consistent information in easy to access formats, to highlight any areas of good practice and to inform local communication strategies about further opportunities to support website development.

The report is based on observations made by Healthwatch research officers of freely available websites related to local GP surgeries. The report has been organised by GP Cluster Area.

Please note that this report relates to findings observed by research officers in relation to the specific project and the specific date range as set out in the methodology section of the report.

GP website audit – Introduction



With a number of key changes being introduced in local general practice, it is important that patients are made aware and kept informed of their options.

Healthwatch Wigan and Leigh decided to review Wigan and Leigh GP websites, and to see to what extent GP cluster areas as a whole are using these key communication tools to help patients to keep informed about local developments in health and to engage with health services digitally.

We used the following criteria when checking Wigan GP websites:

- General website usability and availability.
- Information on two key changes, the shared care record and new primary care professionals.
- Online appointments booking systems; availability and ease of use.
- Information about extended hours GP services and out of hours care.
- Availability of information in different formats, to suit people's individual information access requirements

GP website audit – Key Findings



All of the Wigan GP practices were found to have a website, overall the websites found were functional and had relevant information on them for patients.

There was some inconsistency in the use of terms and clarity of information present both between individual GP Practices within clusters and across the clusters as a whole.

Most websites did not mention the new primary care roles. There was also variation into how the care record was referred to (often called patient care information).

Information for patients about Extended Hours and of Out of Hours Services was patchy.


Many of the Wigan GP Practice websites did have a translate function and/or information in multiple formats online.

GP website audit - Methodology



There are seven GP clusters or service delivery footprints (SDFs) in Wigan. Their websites were checked according to a set of criteria, for clarity, and information content.

Golborne & Lowton and Abram, Hindley, Ince and Platt Bridge somtimes work together. Collectively they are known as LIGA.

Central Wigan and North Wigan sometimes work together too.

GP website audit – Methodology



Criteria

This is the set of criteria used to check clarity and information content across all 62 GP Practices in the seven Wigan GP clusters;

- Name of practice
- Date accessed
- Time accessed
- Is there a website?
- Is the site easy to navigate?
- Is there information about the new shared care record?
- Is there information about the new primary care roles?
- Is there an option for online booking?
- Is there Out of Hours Information?
- Is there information about extended hours?
- Is information available in different formats?

Analysis

The results of the check against our criteria have been analysed using three colours, used to show the level of detail found:

Green - The information required is present

Yellow - Partial information was found

Orange - No information found

General website usability and availability

- It would be preferable for all surgeries to have a similar website layout many *are* similar or have similar tabs and that makes it much easier to navigate
- All surgeries need to have a mechanism for checking that their website tabs are all populated and that the information is up to date.
- Staff profile and/or photos is useful.
- Terminologies used should be consistent, and easy to understand and/or interpret correctly.

Information on the shared care records (SCRs)

• It would be useful for all the websites to have the same information regarding the SCRs as this would help all patients to understand the concept and what it means for them.

New Primary Care Roles (PCRs)

• Very few websites had any information about new roles in primary care. Again it would help patient understanding if information about these developments was more readily available and consistent.

GP website audit – Conclusions



Accessing services digitally

• Almost one third (18) of the websites did not contain any information on online booking. Surgeries should be promoting online bookings alongside a range of other appointment booking options.

Information on out of hours care and the availability of extended hours

• It would be helpful if all websites had the same information about the availability of extended hours, 7 day access, - especially if signed up to 7 day access. It should also be clear what extended hours are i.e. not just showing a later opening time. Unless the website specifically says 'extended hours' this study rated them 'no' as patients may not find this clear.

Whether different formats are offered when using the website or accessing information present there

- Use of pictures and text is useful to ensure easy ready for all.
- It would be helpful for all websites to have the functionality to translate into different languages. Different language fact fact sheets could be made available centrally for all GP practice webs sites to reference.

GP website audit – Recommendations



To the CCG

The CCG Communications Team could usefully provide some toolkit type web materials/copy on the following;

- **Think GP First:** To include key message information plus details of the GP extended hours service, the Out of Hours Service, plus relevant and agreed information /advice about how and when to use NHS Choices, Urgent Care Services, Community Pharmacists, NHS Direct and the Emergency Services.
- **New Roles in Primary Care**: Generic information about the rationale behind the new roles. As the programme becomes more stable this should be updated with consistent information about how and when these services will become available to patients and how patients can access them.

To the GP Neighbourhood Leads

The GP Neighbourhood Leads could usefully;

- Collate information on who is in charge of implementing websites in each GP practice in their area.
- Examine the results of this audit in more detail (the full data set is available on request from (karen@healthwatchwiganandleigh.co.uk) and lead a neighbourhood level discussions looking at sharing good practice/moving towards a more coordinated approach to website content.

GP website audit – Responses to report



It is interesting reading and highlights some of the issues the system has already identified as needing further work, especially around access, consistent patient information and clearer messages around what type of services are available and when to use them.
