A glance over our engagement

In November 2021 we engaged with approximately 8,000 people across Stoke-on-Trent. A breakdown of our engagement methods can be seen next:

Making a difference and what we've achieved

Assisted a resident to regain access to rehab services via a self-referral programme with Harplands Hospital Supported several residents with COVID-19 related queries. This related to what type of vaccines were being offered at particular local vaccination centres We offered 9 grants of up to £2,000 to individuals, grassroot organisations and groups to fund new projects that improves the health and wellbeing of local people

We conducted a Virtual Visit to the Royal Stoke University Hospital Fracture Clinic Residents continue to benefit from our internal dental directory to find a dentist We collected 111 Stokeon-Trent resident views in our Primary and Community Care Survey


