

# Your experiences of the COVID-19 vaccination programme

## Executive Summary

During June and July 2022 Healthwatch Sunderland, in partnership with the Sunderland GP Alliance, launched a survey to gather people's experiences of receiving their COVID-19 vaccine with a focus on whether local people had taken up the offer to be immunised.

The purpose of this report is to share the findings with key NHS providers and commissioners, to help them understand directly from local people what is going well but also what else could be done to improve the delivery of the autumn and winter 2022/2023 vaccine programme.

This report covers those 343 respondents who replied during this period of time.

#### Key themes/findings

The main findings of the survey are as follows:

- Most respondents (66%) had received their first, second and third vaccine.
- Approximately one quarter (24%) had received either one, two or no vaccines.
- Most respondents found it either very easy or fairly easy to get to the venues for their vaccines and would be happy to any local venue for future vaccine appointments.
- Respondents main reason for receiving the vaccine included to protect themselves and/or vulnerable friends & family members.
- Respondent's main reasons for not being fully vaccinated included cultural, religious, or other reasons and /or COVID-19 restrictions have changed and they no longer feel they need to be fully vaccinated.
- Respondents' main reasons for not being vaccinated at all, included they were either not worried about the side effects of COVID-19 or they don't believe there has been enough research carried out.

## Introduction

### What is Healthwatch Sunderland?

Healthwatch Sunderland is the independent local champion for people who use health and social care services. We're here to make sure that those running services put people at the heart of care.

By speaking to Sunderland residents, we aim to understand their needs, experiences and concerns of accessing and using local health and social care services. We can then speak out on their behalf to local service providers, focusing on people's concerns about current services and ensuring they are listened to and addressed by those who are running services.

We encourage and work with local services to involve Sunderland residents in the changes to health and social care provision. The ultimate aim is to get things right for the future, with health and social care services which meet the needs of the local community.

## Methodology

In partnership with the Sunderland GP Alliance, we designed a survey to collect feedback from those patients who had received some or all of their COVID-19 vaccine and those who were still to receive any.

Questions were designed to help understand people's level of vaccination and to identify any potential barriers that may be preventing the uptake of the vaccine.

Members of the public were invited to complete surveys during the months of June and July 2022. Surveys were promoted via the Healthwatch Sunderland e-newsletter, social media channels, website and via networks and contacts within the NHS, social care, and local voluntary and community sector. Many of the organisations kindly promoted the survey on their behalf through their own networks and social media links etc.

Surveys were available to complete online using Survey Monkey or as a paper-based version which was supplied with a selfaddressed envelope. In addition, people could call Healthwatch Sunderland where staff were available to assist in completing the survey over the phone.



## Findings


The findings in this section are based on responses to the survey. In total, there were 343 survey responses.

The majority of those who responded were female (61%), aged between 35 and 64 years old (55%) and white (89%).

The full breakdown of demographic information can be seen in appendices 2.

Please can you tell us which vaccinations you have had?

Most respondents (66%) had received their first, second and third vaccine, a further 18% had received either their first or first and second vaccine. 6% of respondents had received no vaccinations.



### Where did you receive each of your vaccinations? (Please tick all that apply)

Respondents informed that they had received their vaccines at a range of venues, with most receiving them at a Sunderland based location.

For those who responded to say they had received a vaccine at locations other than those venues listed, most had either received them at an out of area location or Sunderland Royal or South Tyneside Hospitals.

How easy or difficult did you find it to get to the venue for each of your vaccinations?

When asked about ease of accessing the venue for their vaccine most responses received showed that people had, in the main, found it either very easy or fairly easy to get to.

When asked to provide additional information on what had made the venue easy or difficult to access people gave a range of responses.

Those who found the venues easy to get to did so, in the main, as it was either easy to locate and well signposted, close to where they live, easy to access via car or public transport or given whilst at work.

Those who found it more difficult to get to, in the main, did in the main as the location was unfamiliar to them, they needed to use two buses to get to, they had a long distance to travel or they had encountered parking issues at the venue.

Please can you tell us what was your reason for being vaccinated? (Please tick all that apply)

Most people who received their vaccinations did so to either protect themselves and/or their family and friends.

Of those 31 respondents who ticked to say they had been vaccinated for reasons other than those listed, most stated their reasons were because they either felt pressurised by family members or their place of work, they couldn't afford to take leave from work to isolate or due to fear.

### "I could not afford the time off work isolating every time I came in contact with somebody with the virus."

"I felt pressured because of the job I do."

If you have <u>NOT</u> been fully vaccinated, why did you not complete the course? (Please tick all that apply)

Of those people who responded to say they hadn't been fully vaccinated, most people cited they hadn't done so due to cultural, religious or other reasons.

Respondents who choose cultural, religious or other reasons as they option were asked to provide additional information on their answer. Most of the 52 respondents stated their reasons were either due to having a bad reaction to one of their

vaccines and therefor they don't want another or that they don't feel they needed further protection/additional vaccines.

"I am well at the moment and don't need further protection."

"I don't really mix with others, and I am being careful."

If you decided against being vaccinated <u>at all</u>, please tell us why. (Please tick all that apply)

Of those respondents not to have received any vaccinations, most responses for the reasons why included not being worried about the effects of COVID-19 or another reason.

Respondents who choose other reasons as they option were asked to provide additional information on their answer. Most of the 23 respondent's comments received could be grouped into the following themes; already had COVID-19, they believe they have antibodies, or they don't believe there has been enough research carried out.

"I had COVID whilst in hospital and was alright so why have it? I just don't want it."

"Ridiculous, not enough research and I have antibodies."

If you were to book your next appointment, how would you prefer to do this? (Please tick all that apply)

Most people would prefer to either book their next appointment on-line or by phone to their GP.

Of those who ticked other as their answer, most either commented that they would like the vaccine team or GP to contact them, or they won't be booking another appointment as they don't wish to have any further vaccines.


"A phone call from COVID vaccine team."

"Don't plan on getting any further vaccines for COVID."

"I think 3 vaccines are enough."

Which would be your preferred choice of site to receive your vaccine? (Please tick all that apply)

Most survey respondents informed that they would be happy to attend any local venue to receive their vaccine or ticked other venue as their preferred choice. When asked to specify which venue other than those listed, they would prefer to go to for their vaccine, many either gave Sunderland Royal or South Tyneside Hospitals.



# Would you like to add any additional comments about the vaccination programme?

When asked if respondents would like to provide any further comments about the vaccination programme a range of responses were received and can be themed into positive and negative.

Positive feedback could, in the main, be themed into; the vaccine programme was well organised and efficient, delivered by professional staff and helpful volunteers or respondents were grateful to have the opportunity to receive the vaccine.

"All of the vaccinations experiences were magnificent - as a very hard of hearing person the meeter and greeter gentleman was spot on with his disability awareness, which made the whole experience that much easier and reassuring." "I had no problems; felt I was able to get an appointment quickly. 1st appointment was arranged through employer, second appointment I received a call and an appointment was made over the phone, third appointment I booked online. No complaints."

"I was so pleased to be given the opportunity to be vaccinated. I thought it was a well organised and ran programme and would like to thank all of those involved in the process."

Negative feedback could be themed into; negative side effects from the vaccine, pressurised into receiving the vaccine and lack of evidence on long term effects of the vaccine.

"I do not feel that enough information has been provided about the side effects of the vaccination, especially long-term effects."

"I reacted to all of my vaccines; unwell with temperatures, shaking, joint pains and generally feeling unwell therefore I would have to have a good think of whether I would receive any more."

"Side effects not good. After having 3 doses I will not be having more."

## Next steps

The response to our survey has been incredible, we appreciate the time taken by all 343 respondents who shared their experiences with us.

We are sharing that feedback with Sunderland GP Alliance and other key providers to provide robust information upon which to build future services.

Comments received from survey respondents will also be shared with service providers where appropriate.
