Coronation House



2025

In April 2025 we visited Coronation House to speak with service users about their experience with the home. This visit formed part of our ongoing targeted engagement of visiting care homes around Norfolk.

Coronation House is a purpose-built care home in Thetford, a town in Breckland, and is owned and managed by Danforth Care. The home provides residential, respite and dementia care for people aged 65 or over.

From this visit we received eight reviews for the home. We received six from services users and these have an average star rating of 4.8 out of 5. We also collected two reviews from staff members both of whom rated the home as five stars. The overall rating therefore was 4.9 stars out of 5.

Healthwatch Norfolk Officers who visited Coronation House noted:

The home, built around a year ago, was designed to optimise accessibility and comfort for service users and their families. There is seating at the end of each corridor, a library, cinema, and lounge area that opens onto the garden which is often used for family visits. Service users enjoy helping in the garden. They pot new plants, water the area and make fat balls for the birds.

Options are given for meal times and residents with sensitivities or particular requests can be accommodated. 'Show plates' are used to remind those with dementia what's available and aid them to make their choices.



Visitors to the home include a regular hairdresser, vicar, and pre-schoolers. Service users are also taken out on trips outside the home ranging from shopping to museum visits.

The activities programme is comprehensive and very popular with service users and staff alike. Posters display what's on and staff also remind and encourage everybody to take part. For those wishing to stay in their rooms, an activities trolley is taken around so they can join in. The home has an active social media presence so family members can watch their relatives having fun!

The Lifestyle Managers cover seven days per week to ensure there's plenty to be involved with. Ideas are enhanced by service user's suggestions which are sought in regular resident meetings. Accessible exercise classes take place alongside theme days to celebrate national events or different genres like Disney. One-to-one activities such as board games with service users are also provided. During our visit we met some chicks the service users had hatched from eggs!



Overall, the service users we spoke to were happy with the quality and choice of food with two people describing it as "excellent". We were told about the interesting variety of activities on offer and that there is plenty to keep occupied with outside of formal arrangements. All service users were pleased with their rooms in terms of suitability and cleanliness. Staff attitudes and interactions were spoken about positively, however one service user felt there was a shortage of cover at night times.

Comment from the provider:

"The home manager takes these concerns serious and has met with the resident in question.

The GM monitors call bells closely and ensure the residents who need assistance do get this. I understand that when a resident wants to get up it might not always be that exact time. I have spoken to the resident and shared the call bell analysis and my report and observations and expressed as the GM I do monitor very closely and I am in the home early each morning so I can follow up my observations."
